Whether you are processing payroll for 50 employees or 500 employees, batch processing is your best bet for saving time and eliminating errors.

You can process up to 125 employees per screen, entering hours, receipts, and tips for each employee, moving from cell to cell on the batch screen.

With batch format 1, your screen has columns for:

- units for position 1, 2, 3.
- cash, charge receipts; cash, charge tips.
- units for additional income 1, 2.
- holiday, vacation, sick.

6.0 **Xtra** users have two additional columns for amounts of additional income 3 and 4.

BATCH PROCESSING cont'd

On the batch screen, you see information for 20 employees at a time. Scroll back and forth between the left and right batch screens with [Tab] and [Shift][Tab]. Scroll up and down to see all 125 employees with [Page Up] and [Page Down].

More than 125? Press <End> to process the first batch, and the second batch of 125 appears on the screen. After processing all, you can call up the interactive screen (via **make corrections**) for any employee. Here you can make changes or corrections and see their calculated payroll.

Processing batch gives you a lot of flexibility. You choose to bring information in from different sources or to have blank fields in which to enter information:

- 1. Zeroes. To key in the information yourself, choose zeroes. You'll get blank fields on the batch screen after each employee name.
- 2. Standard. If your employees work the same number of hours each pay period, enter the hours (units) for each job in the employee's file. Choose standard when processing batch to display those units (which you can change on the batch screen or via "make corrections").
- 3. Current. Choose current to display each employee's current information. Use this if you forgot to initialize a new employee and already

entered the information for everyone else on the batch screen. Press <End> to process the batch information. Then follow the next steps.

<Esc> back to the main menu to initialize the new employee. Choose CALCULATE (instead of RESUME)/BATCH, and choose CURRENT. The information you entered previously on the batch screen will be there. Also there will be the new employee with blank fields where you can now enter that employee's information.

4. Timekeeper. This is the real time-saver! If you've got one of our time clock/POS interfaces, choose Timekeeper to have *PayMaster* bring the information from your time clock to the computer.

Note: Respond *no* to **Add to current?**, unless you are entering information for your biweekly payroll a week at a time.

Before pressing <End> to process the batch, print the batch report by pressing <Alt>+ at both the left and right batch screens to double check your figures.

The batch report ("hash" totals) shows what you displayed, entered, or brought in from your time clock for the first batch of 125 employees. And it adds down and across, totalling each column and row, which you can then compare to your input sheet totals

Tax law changes

State minimum wage

NM Effective 7/1/93, minimum wage is \$4.25. State's work week is reduced to 40 hours, down from 48 hours. Percentage of tip credit is increased to 50%.

ME Effective 10/1/93, tip credit will be the same as federal (50%).

State unemployment

- CT Taxable wage base \$9,000 effective 1/1/94.
- IA \$13,900 wage base for 1994.

- WI New quarterly report on mag media if 250+ employees, effective 4/1/93.

State withholding

- HI Effective 1/1/94, maximum withholding rate increases from 8% to 10%.
- IL The withholding rate scheduled to drop on 7/1/93 will **not** drop. Instead, it will remain at 3%.

- MI Local: Muskegon 1% income tax (.5% for non-residents working in the city).
- MT New withholding rate of 6.7% becomes effective 7/1/93. Rate is retroactive to 1/1/93.

At some point, your *PayMaster* data backup will require an additional diskette because of Version 6.0 data files' increased size. Watch the screen when backing up. If it beeps and says **insert diskette 2, 3, etc.,** do so.

Reminder — Process end of quarter

Then and only then will your current quarter and next quarter reports contain the correct information. Once you process end of quarter at the end of March, June, and September, you can print reports from "last quarter."

Q & A

- **Q.** Is there a way to print my pre-check register without any select or void checks processed since my last payroll?
- **A.** There is now with the newest release of *PayMaster* (6.01A). If *PayMaster* detects any select or void checks since the last payroll, you'll be asked when you print a pre-check register if you want to include them.

If you're on Auto Update, this will be in the next program upgrade you receive. If you have an urgent need for it, call us.

- **Q.** I allocate by hours. Are the units for miscellaneous income (the third field after regular and overtime) used in allocating?
- **A.** Yes. *PayMaster* treats these units as hours and uses them in allocating.
- **Q.** How do I reprint just some of my checks if the printer chewed them up.
- **A.** 1. From the main menu, choose RESUME.
 - 2. Respond *no* to everything until asked **Print checks?** (Make sure *PayMaster* says, before it gets to this point, that **Files have already been updated**.)
 - 3. Respond yes to Print checks?
 - 4. At the **Employee** prompt, enter the code of the first employee needed.
 - 5. At the **Starting number** prompt, enter the number of the next check.
 - 6. **Resume an interrupted run?** *Yes.* Then, the check register will print all of the checks, including the ones that jammed, instead of beginning with the first reprinted check. Then void the jammed checks from the register and print the month-to-date check register for that date.

If you want to print only one check, follow these steps: after you respond *no* to **Print alignment check?** or **Reprint?**, immediately press the space bar to pause after printing the first check. Once <**Pause>** appears in the lower right corner, press <**Esc>** to return to the menu.

- **Q.** Do I need to void mangled checks?
- **A.** If you do not use the check register \underline{no} , you do

not have to void the mangled checks.

If you <u>do</u> use the check register — <u>yes</u>, you want to void them. But void them **only** from the check register, **not** from the pay files. When *PayMaster* asks **Deduct from employee pay files?**, respond *no*.

- **Q.** What is the input sheet used for? I just enter my hours from the time cards.
- A. Many companies have the managers fill out and approve the input sheets, plus run totals across and down. The input sheets are then sent to the person processing payroll, who enters the information on the batch screen. Printing the batch report gives you hash totals to double check against the input sheet totals. See page 3 for an illustration.
- **Q.** Where can I get address labels and time card labels that match *PayMaster*'s format?
- A. Address labels, time cards labels, and any other forms you need (checks, W-2 forms, matching window envelopes, Create-A-Check supplies) can be ordered from us. Address labels are \$22 + \$6 shipping per box of 5,000. Time card labels are \$39 + \$8 shipping per box of 10,000. Add \$5 COD if not prepaid, and 4½% sales tax if in VA. Call for order form/price list for other supplies.

When the University of Maryland (UMD) Book Center decided to switch from mechanical to computerized time clocks in 1989, they selected Computer Aid's time & attendance system. The Book Center is a self-supporting department of the UMD College Park campus. It does \$12 million in business each year selling text, technical, and general books; office and school supplies; Terrapin (their sports mascot) clothing; snacks; and other items.

During "rush" — two weeks of heavy business at the start of each semester which are like the last shopping days before Christmas — the Book Center is open from 8 am to 8 pm Monday through Sunday. They supply every book required on campus for both day and night classes for 36,000 students.

To do this, they employ 150 regular and 125 student employees. They fill an additional 60 jobs with temporary employees, who number a lot more than 60 since many of them work only one or two days.

Payroll is very demanding because, although bi-weekly, time sheets have to be accurately completed **each week** by Monday afternoon for the temporary agency and, very importantly, for the state accounting office.

Connie Shaughnessy, Personnel Administrator, and Lorraine DePrima, Associate Director, selected Computer Aid over other companies because:

- 1. The hardware has battery backup, which means that not only is the information still there when the main power goes out, but the time clocks can continue to be used even with just the battery.
- 2. The software "is very user friendly."
- 3. There is local support.

Connie, who has 17 years of experience, initiates all screening and hiring of new employees, and puts them into the payroll system. She says, "We couldn't have found a better company. Computer Aid provides total quality support. Everyone has been responsive to our needs."

Cheryl Coates, who has been with UMD for 28 years, does all the payroll work — getting the information ready and entering it into the State's payroll system. "Before getting Computer Aid's automated system, the Book Center's mechanical clocks added up the total hours, but did not compute overtime or show any of their many kinds of leave. And, if the power went out, which it often does, they couldn't use the time clocks — so times were hand written on the cards. Then, when the employees started punching in again, frequently the clock punches were over the writing. Then you couldn't read the clock punches or the handwritten punches!"

One of Computer Aid's time clocks is installed in the Book Center and another in the warehouse, off campus. Both have modems and are polled automatically each night by a central computer. The time clock modems are set to answer only between 1:00 am and 3:00 am — allowing the phones to be used as regular telephones during business hours and eliminating the need for separate phone lines.

The clocks have bar code readers, so that photo identification cards can be used. Bar code software generates a bar code with the employee's SSN, which is printed on label paper and applied to the existing card. This saves money and time, because the employees need only one card and one number.

In 1992, the Adele Stamp Union (student union) at the University went onto Computer Aid's time & attendance system. Three more time clocks were added and the Stamp Union's payroll function was merged with the Book Center's. Previously, another payroll clerk did the Stamp Union payroll and Cheryl did the Book Center's. Cheryl says "I'm now preparing payroll for the Book Center's employees and the Stamp Union's 200 employees in just one day — half the time it used to take me to do just the Book Center payroll."

You can print reports for current or previous pay periods, by employee name or employee number, for one employee or all.

The time card report, shown in the 40-column format, is designed to replace the old-fashioned punch clock time card. The report is easy to read and shows all punches and totals for the pay period, including tips. The "7:05A" on Tuesday has no impact on the daily total, because the punch is in the grace zone. But, the "7:09A" on Wednesday results in a 15 minute "dock" of the employee's pay.

Supervisors can enter and/or edit employee punches; enter sick, vacation, holiday, personal time, etc.; and set the clock date and time.

TASC automatically adjusts the time for daylight savings time once the flag is set at system installation. And, its internal battery protects data for up to 7 months.

There are no pay period closing procedures to remember. Once the TASC transaction memory is filled, it will automatically write the new transactions over the oldest ones.

Designed to maintain over 4,000 transactions, the Time America time clock will accommodate up to 150 employees on a weekly, bi-weekly, or semi-monthly payroll. You can have up to five schedules, and seven function keys.

It has a standard magnetic strip reader or optional bar code reader.

If you have a PC connected to the time clock, you have other software choices: TA 200, TA 2000 or Simplicity software.

The Time America stand-alone clock with built-in software is \$1,241 (plastic casing) or \$1,408 (metal casing). Modem is \$250. Printer (80 column) is \$350. Add shipping and (VA residents) sales tax.

Time Card Report

What a great idea! A stand-alone computerized time clock with optional printer.

We're really excited about the new Time America time clock that does not have to be connected to a PC. It's a self-contained time and attendance system (has its own computer built-in with TASC software). And, you can get a small printer on which to print reports.

You have the option, with a cable or modem, of communicating to a PC to send the information directly to *PayMaster*.

TASC allows employees to clock in and out, using either the keypad or credit card style badges. Employees can enter tips and do department transfers, and can look up previous punches. When clocking in and out, the time clock will display the

employee's name and weekly accumulated regular and overtime hours. This eliminates the need for the employee to see a paper time card.

If you have a printer, you can allow employees to print a time card for the current pay period. You can also print these reports:

- Time card
- Missing punch
- Hours summary
- Department
- Transaction list (details all transactions in the clock chronologically).
- Who's in
- Who's not in (of those scheduled).
- Employee list
- Policy list (5 separate sets of pay rules)

INCLUDE w/W-2 orders (see SK's copy of Dec 1992 BP)

Steps to take before printing W-2s:

Make sure your company withholding I.D. is entered on the tax tables. INIT/TAX/STATE/GENERAL. This is what *PayMaster* uses to print the state I.D. on the W-2s.

If you have to make adjustments for third party sick pay, life insurance premiums on the value above \$50,000, personal use of company car, etc., do so before printing the W-2s on plain paper.

Verify that your figures are correct:

- 1. Print the W-2s on plain paper.
- 2. Take your four quarterly 941 and make sure the totals add up to the annual totals on the W-2s.
- 3. Make sure any additional income (life insurance premium, fringe benefits, etc.) appears in the correct box.

Double check your company name, address, etc. federal I.D., state I.D.

42nd W-2 must be last one on page, so always start the first W-2 at the top of the page.

Hard disk almost full?

Now's the time to clean up your hard disk to make room for processing end of year. You might also want room for your W-2 data if you have to do your first 1994 payroll before printing your 1993 W-2s. Don't wait until the last minute. If you're on support and want help estimating how much room you need or erasing your files, give us a call.
